Family Camping at Jones Creek Campground

The group camp site at Jones Creek Campground has been reserved for Kenilworth Church Friday, Saturday and Sunday August 12, 13 and 14. There is room for anyone who wants to camp to pitch their tent for any or all of those nights. Swimming, hiking, horse shoes, relaxing and the visitor's center are a few of the activities available. You will need your own camping equipment. It will cost \$10 per night per family. Please advise Peggy Morgan if you are planning to camp.

Worship in the park: August 14 Smith Homestead

We will be worshipping at the Smith Homestead, a day use area located in the Tillamook Forest along highway 6 at approximately milepost 22. It should take one hour to drive there from the church if there is no traffic and you follow all speed limits. Head west on Highway 26 until the turn off to Tillamook Highway 6. Follow that until you see the signs for Smith Homestead/Jones Creek Campground; turn right and immediately right into the Homestead. There should be plenty of parking, including handicap.

The Homestead has long picnic tables with separate benches inside. The building has sliding walls and garage door type windows to open it up on three sides. There is a fireplace and a counter with electrical outlets, but no kitchen facilities or water in the building.

Outside there is a large charcoal BBQ. Restrooms are near; they are pit toilets. Outside there are various reader boards telling the history of the homestead.

There is a pleasant walking trail through the forest that leads to the meadow trail. All are short trails. The Wilson River is right there and is a favorite swimming hole. The access to the water is rather steep. All swimmers should wear water shoes or tennis shoes as there are lots of rocks and a little sand. The best swimming hole for kids is at the end of the meadow trail. It has a sandier beach access and no drop off. Also lots of people don't know about it and therefore the use is minimal. The Tillamook Forestry Visitor's Center is 1/4 mile away and one could walk on the nice trail or drive there. It is a very informative and interactive center with exhibits about the history of the forest, its habitat, its uses and much more. The movie telling of the Tillamook burn is about 15 minutes and worth every minute.

You will need to bring:

- Folding chairs if you don't like sitting on benches
- Bathing suit and water shoes
- Towels
- Sunscreen, bug spray
- Hand sanitizer
- Beverages to drink
- A dish to share

- Burgers and Hot Dogs
- Charcoal and lighter fluid
- Cooking utensils
- Paper plates and plastic ware
- Napkins
- A large container of ice water
- Drinking cups

Creamy Grape Salad

As enjoyed at KPC

- 1 8-ounce package cream cheese, softened
- 1 cup (8 ounces) sour cream
- 1/3rd cup sugar
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 2 pounds seedless red grapes
- 2 pounds seedless green grapes
- 3 Tablespoons brown sugar
- 3 Tablespoons chopped pecans

Directions:

1. In a large bowl, beat cream cheese, sour cream, sugar and vanilla until blended. Add grapes and toss.
2. Transfer to a serving bowl. Cover and refrigerate until serving.
3. Sprinkle with brown sugar and pecans just before serving.

Yield: 21-24 servings



Becoming an Earth Care Congregation

The Session has approved our becoming a Certified Earth Care Congregation. For approval, we need to earn at least 25 points in each of four categories: Worship, Education, Facilities, and Outreach.

FACILITIES (25 points needed for certification, for overall 100 point total)

The areas included in the Facilities section are Energy Conservation, Heating and Cooling, Lighting, Heating Water, Renewable Energy and Alternative Building, Water Conservation, Recycling/Waste, Reusing, Food Consumption, Cleaning Products, Grounds, and Storm Water Management. In this section, KPC can earn points for doing an energy audit, having a preseason HVAC checkup, using a zoned heating or cooling system and energy efficient lights. KPC has converted to LED exit lights and plans to install motion sensors on some lights, especially the restrooms. Our use of reusable dinnerware, cloth table covers, and recycling will help us earn enough points in this area for certification.
